BILL OF RIGHTS IN THE KENYAN CONSTITUTION

Chapter Four outlines the fundamental rights and freedoms guaranteed to all individuals in Kenya

01. Right to Life

Everyone has the right to life, and this right should be protected by law.

Everyone is equal before the law and should not be discriminated against based on statuses such as race, gender, ethnicity, and religion.

02. Equality and Freedom from Discrimination

O3. Freedom of Expression

Individuals have the right to express their opinions freely, including the freedom to share information.

This encompasses the right to respect, privacy, and freedom from exploitation.

Free practice of religion practices, and a guarantee of freedom of conscience.

Every child has the right to compulsory basic education.

07. Right to Fair Trial

Fair hearing in legal proceedings, ensuring justice is accessible and impartial.

All are able to participate in government, vote, and hold public office.

All have right to work, fair wages, and social security.
